10 PHILOSOPHY COURSES

- Course 1: 1120 Logic, Reasoning, and Critical Thinking *or* 356 Symbolic Logic
- Course 2: 2210 Early Modern Philosophy
- Course 3: 2220 Greek Philosophy *or* 2225 Greek Thought
- Course 4: 333 Buddhist Philosophy *or* 334 Indian Philosophy *or* 336 Chinese Philosophy
- Course 5: 350 Philosophy of Science *or* 352 Theory of Knowledge *or* 354 Metaphysics *or* 455 Philosophy of Mind
- Course 6: 358 Ethical Theory *or* 371 Classical Social & Political Philosophy *or* 372 Modern Social & Political Philosophy *or* 381 Philosophy of Law
- Courses 7-10: Four Philosophy electives, two of which must be at the 400-level.
Normally 1000-level Philosophy courses will count as an elective only if taken prior to any 2000- or higher-level Philosophy course.

PHILOSOPHY MINOR

6 PHILOSOPHY COURSES

- Course 1: 1120 Logic, Reasoning, and Critical Thinking *or* 356 Symbolic Logic
- Courses 2-3: At least two of the following:
- 1115 Introduction to Philosophy
 - 2210 Early Modern Philosophy
 - 2220 Greek Philosophy *or* 2225 Greek Thought
- Students may not count both 2220 and 2225 towards this requirement.
- Courses 4-6: Three Philosophy electives, all of which must be at the 300-level or above.
For PHIL 1115 to be used to fulfill a minor requirement, it must be taken before any 300- or higher-level Philosophy course that is counted toward the minor.

NOTES ABOUT THE MAJOR AND MINOR PROGRAMS

- Note 1:** Only courses in which a student has received a C grade or better (not C-) will be accepted toward the major or minor.
- Note 2:** *For students pursuing either of the major programs above:* At least 15 credit hours of major coursework (i.e., at least five courses counting toward the major) must be completed at UNM.
- Note 3:** Students wishing to pursue graduate work in Philosophy are highly encouraged to take PHIL 356 either to fulfill the logic requirement for the major or minor or as an elective.
- Note 4:** Students interested in a major program that combines upper-division coursework in Philosophy and English should consider the 45-credit hour English-Philosophy major. Students pursuing the English-Philosophy major are not required to complete a minor.

ENGLISH-PHILOSOPHY MAJOR

15 COURSES

- Six English courses, four of which are to be numbered 300 or above.
- Six Philosophy courses, four of which are to be numbered 300 or above.
- Two additional English or Philosophy courses numbered 300 or above.
